

## Gundahoo River Outfitters Equipment List

This list is only intended as a guideline. Bring what you feel you need. These are a few suggestions to compliment your own list.

- 1 pair of leather hunting boots (durable for rocky terrain and waterproof ie: Kenetrek, Zamberlan, Meindl, Lowa, to name a few)
- 1 pair gaiters (soft noise)
- 1 pair of slip on camp shoes
- 2 pairs of gloves, leather & or insulated (also cap/toque)
- 1 warm coat
- Wool/fleece sweater (Merino wool is great for layering)
- Wool socks
- Rain clothes (coat/pants) Breathable for hiking yet durable and waterproof (riding the horses, through branches; are hardest on rain clothes)
- Sleeping bag & pad (ie: thermarest or Xped)
- Towel/swim trunks (hot springs about an hour drive from main camp if we have the time)
- Insect Repellent
- Water bottle with filter
- Binoculars
- Head lamp
- Rifle and ammo (alternatively, Archery set up)
- Rifle or Bow scabbard for use on horse (leather or cordura) \*Trail Max Scabbard (brand name) makes a quality product (available online through 'Outfitter Supply', store in Montana)
- Small day backpack; or for sheep hunters a pack big enough to spike out for couple days.
- 4 large meat bags for combo hunters
- Spotting scope if you have one
- Camera & extra batteries (no generators in out camps only in base camp for first and last day of hunt)
- Personal first aid kit-headache, stomach, flu and cold medication, insect sting lotion etc.
- Waterproof Duffle bag for taking gear into hunting camp.....approx 40 lbs

\*non-alcoholic beverages are provided by GRO, for those wishing other options, Ft. Nelson has the only store to make purchases.
